

Advocacy Campaigns & Communications Coordinator Full-time, permanent

At Tearfund, we believe that God has called us to a mission that defends the cause of the poor and speaks up for those who would otherwise be silenced.

Tearfund engages Kiwis in financial generosity to fund Tearfund's development initiatives delivered by local partners who work in places that are facing issues of poverty, scarcity, disempowerment and injustice. This work is broad and covers the sectors of modern slavery, child development, farming and enterprise and humanitarian response.

Alongside our fundraising work, we engage in advocacy work to influence the decisions, practices and policies of decision-makers to address the underlying causes of poverty, bring justice and support good development. The Advocacy Team is dedicated to tackling the hard subjects, speaking graciously but truthfully in pursuit of a just and fair world. We reflect on our choices which impact other people's right to life's necessities and offer supporters opportunities to take action in their own lives to advocate for issues of justice.

About the role:

The Advocacy Campaigns & Communications Coordinator is responsible for delivering Tearfund's portfolio of public-facing advocacy campaigns to mobilise Tearfund's supporters, the New Zealand church and the general public to take action on key advocacy issues.

The role requires someone who is highly organised, professional, a project management whizz and has excellent writing skills, ideally with experience in campaign messaging and strategies for online platforms.

- Designing and delivering Tearfund's public-facing advocacy campaigns
- Developing campaign strategies and key messaging
- Leading internal and external collaboration required to deliver the campaign
- Developing social media and digital advertising plans for campaigns
- Writing and producing digital content and materials to communicate around the campaign and inspire Tearfund supporters and NZ churches to get involved
- Building relationships with key players and organisations within the sectors that are relevant to the Advocacy Plan
- Undertaking speaking engagements and representing Tearfund at relevant events
- Staying abreast of changes, learnings and developments in the sectors that are relevant to the Advocacy Plan

- Proven project management experience

- Excellent written communication skills, preferably having gained experience in a corporate environment
- Strong verbal communication and presentation skills, with some experience talking to large groups

- A positive attitude with a willingness to pitch in where needed to get the job done
